#### LIVESTOCK INFO FOR FAIR

This year, **ALL** livestock (beef and dairy cattle, sheep, meat and dairy goats, swine, horses) must be identified and reported to the Extension Office by **May 1**.

All animals that might be shown need to have permanent ID, whether a county or state 4-H eartag, or a home eartag and tattoo associated with registration papers, or horse ID papers.

- County eartags cost \$1.00.
- State EID eartags cost \$3.25 (sheep, goat, swine) or \$4.00 (beef)

# The permanent ID of any animal you might bring to fair must be reported by May 1.

You may report more animals than you will end up bringing, but if the animal is not reported, it cannot be shown at the fair.

#### **WEIGH-INS**

All market beef, sheep, and goats must be weighed-in and eartagged at the set dates prior to the fair.

Spring beef weigh-in will be on Saturday, March 24 at the Fairgrounds from 10am-12pm.

- Bucket calves need a county eartag.
- Breeding heifers and cows must be identified with a county or state 4-H eartag OR registration tattoo.

Spring sheep and goat weigh-in will be on Saturday, April 28 at the Fairgrounds from 10am-12pm.

- Breeding ewes/does must be identified with a county or state 4-H eartag OR registration tattoo.
- ALL sheep and goats must have a valid scrapie ID/eartag.

#### STATE FAIR AND KJLS UPDATES

Those wishing to show market animals at the state fair or KJLS must go through the nomination process for their animals, which includes:

- Identification with a state 4-H EID tag
- Submission of a DNA sample
- Submission of a nomination form and declaration form
- Payment of \$8.00

DNA sample submission envelopes will be available at the weigh-ins or at the office.

#### Due dates:

- Market beef: **May 1**
- Commercial breeding heifers: June 15
- Market lambs, commercial ewes: June 15
- Meat goats: **June 15**
- Market hogs, barrows, and commercial breeding gilts: June 15
- Purebred breeding gilts: **June 15** (EID recommended but not required)

Remember: **nomination is not entry** to the state fair or KJLS; entries are due later in July.
