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STAY STRONG STAY HEALTHY - This is a Stay Healthy exercise program for older adults that targets: strength, balance and

flexibility. The SSSH program focuses on improving the health and well-being of older adults. The goal of the program is to provide safe, structured and effective strength training for older adults.

I taught this 8 week (17 sessions) program in 2019. Our class was held at the Troy Community Building with 8 participants. This was not a big class, but a class with significant physical needs.

Impact: Everyone improved in post assessments in one way or another! The targets of increasing strength, balance and flexibility were accomplished!
